The Campbell Street Solution

The Campbell Street project will create 12 units of Indigenous-led transitional housing for women, children, youth (18-25), and gender diverse individuals, many of whom are fleeing gender-based violence and unsafe living conditions.

This project is rooted in:

- Trauma-responsive care
- Culturally grounded, Indigenous-led supports
- Safety, dignity, and long-term stability

Dignity-Affirming Care

For many residents, Campbell Street will be the first home they have had in years.

Campbell Street will help to:

- Create immediate stability and comfort
- Reduce the need to return to unsafe situations
- Support trauma recovery and mental well-being
- Allow families and children to settle quickly and safely
- Turn housing into a home, not just a unit.



Together, we can ensure that when doors open at Campbell Street, they open to fully furnished homes, renewed hope, and a future rooted in safety and dignity.





About Brantford Native Housing

Founded in 1986, Brantford Native Housing is the only Indigenous-led housing provider serving the urban and rural Indigenous populations in Brantford and Brant County.

- Over 180 housing units
- Transitional, supportive, affordable, and market housing
- A For Indigenous, By Indigenous (FIBI) approach rooted in culture, dignity, and community care.

Why This Project Matters

Indigenous women are disproportionately impacted by homelessness, violence, and housing insecurity in Brantford and Brant County.

- In 2025, 62% of people experiencing homelessness in Brantford identified as Indigenous, and 66% of those individuals were women.
- Since 2018, **30 Indigenous women** have tragically died while waiting for BNH housing. Half of these deaths have occurred since 2022, marking the growing need for housing for women.

These statistics embody mothers, daughters, sisters, aunts, and community members. Their loss underscores the reality that housing insecurity remains a fundamental factor contributing to violence, exploitation, and premature mortality.
